

Handling Betrayal

Definition: Betrayal is an act of deliberate disloyalty.

First Point: Betrayal is especially painful because it typically comes from a friend, not an enemy. (2 Sam. 15-17)

- \Rightarrow 1 Chron. 17:33
- \Rightarrow Psalms 41:9; 55:12-17

Second Point: Betrayal blindsides us because it ignores past kindnesses. (2 Chron. 22-24)

 \Rightarrow Luke 11:47-51

Applications for Overcoming Betrayal:

- 1. Call out to God.
- 2. Do not repay evil for evil. (1 Peter 2:23)
- 3. Forgive quickly and rebuild trust over time.
- 4. Accept that some folks CAN'T be trusted. (Rom. 12:18-19)
